FOOD SERVICES:

The **Dining Hall** will be open for a hot meal, each day at Noon. Fast food will be served after the evening service. Family Camp meals are being provided by Divine Dining.

The **TuckShop/Camp Store** will be open every afternoon and after the evening services.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

CURFEW: Noise Curfew is 11:00 p.m and Curfew (indoors) by 12:00 midnight. All persons not registered to reside on-site, are expected to leave by curfew. **Parents are responsible for having their children and teenagers returned to their accommodations by the required curfew. The dining hall will be locked at 11:30 p.m.**

Parents, please be aware of a disturbing trend among some of the teens. This has happened in past years and again in July of this year. Teens have been out at night, running in front of vehicles and then as they come close, running into the ditch. Not only is this a safety issue for the teens, it is also a safety issue for the vehicles having to hit the breaks or swerve to miss someone. Please be aware that should this happen again, those involved will be asked to leave the premises. As hard as it may be for parents to believe that their child is involved, it is a reality, and as a parent or guardian, it is your responsibility to instruct your children, and be aware of where they are after dark.

OFFICE: The front office is open 24 hours a day. There is a public telephone in the office. No calls to the U.S. or outside of Canada.

TAX & FEE PAYMENTS: Payments are due by Sunday July 30th Someone from the Finance Committee will be in the office both Sundays during Family Camp from 1 - 2 P.M. to collect cabin tax money. Also, please remember you can always drop off your payment in the drop off box in the main office door. We also accept e-transfers for payments. LAUNDRY: The coin operated laundry room is completed. Please note that you require **TWO LOONIES** for washing and **TWO** for drying. **Please bring the correct change. We do not have the capacity to**

make change for you.

LIBRARY: A library is available in the front part of the office for all campers. If you borrow something, please return .

CDs are available of all sermons and teaching for \$5.00 per CD. Special pricing on complete sets of 5 CDs or more. *MP3 audio will be available at the end of camp.* Sermon CDs are available from past years. See Ken Meats in the sound booth.

GARBAGE: During Family Camp, sanitation containers are conveniently placed throughout the grounds. Only household garbage, in secure plastic bags, are to be placed in these containers. Garbage is to be left at these designated areas only, and prior to the last daily pickup around 4:00 P.M. No garbage is to be left in the containers overnight. In the interest of safety and sanitation never leave waste or debris at the roadside where it obstructs traffic. **It would be helpful to the Maintenance staff and volunteers if you could take your household garbage to the bins located by the Maintenance Buildings across from the soccer field. PLEASE BE AWARE THAT WE NOW HAVE A BIN FOR RECYCLABLES. PLEASE REFER TO THE POSTED LIST FOR ACCEPTABLE PRODUCTS TO RECYCLE.**

PETS: Domestic pets are permitted on the campgrounds, in private cabins. Dogs are banned from areas where people congregate ie. around the playgrounds, the tennis/basketball courts, the store, the tabernacle, the chapel and the dining hall. **Pets are not allowed in any Camp owned cottages or buildings (with the exception of a service animal/guide dog required by people with disabilities.)** We request that campers be considerate of neighbours by ensuring that pets remain quiet, indoors or on a leash, and under control at all times. All pet waste must be cleaned up immediately and placed in an appropriately sealed garbage container. Dogs over 25 pounds which are outside of the owner's cabin must wear a muzzle, and their leash must be held by (and the dog must be under the control of) a person 16 years of age or older.

Hydro: Please help us conserve hydro by not leaving your air conditioning unit running when you are not in your cabin. We are on time of use billing, and during the hours of 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. the rates are the highest. Also, please make sure that when you leave your cabin (during the season and at the end of the season) all the lights are turned off. Throughout the season, we have noticed that lights have been left on, although no one is present in the cabin. Please be reminded that increased costs are reallocated to cabin owners on their next year's invoice.

Automatic External Defibrillator (AED): is located in the office by the Nursing Station. An AED is a small, portable device used to identify cardiac rhythms and deliver a shock to correct abnormal electrical activity in the heart. It is recommended that these devices are available in public venues. Directions for use are in a pamphlet with the device. The device can be used by a bystander, not just medical professionals.

As Cabin Owners, we have documentation on you and know that you meet the requirements, however we would not have information on your guests. As a cabin owner, you are responsible for your guests and we need to know that you have authorized them to be there and that you take responsibility for them.
